

Emergency Medicine List

Medicine	Preparation and Strength	Quantity
Adrenaline	(0.3mg) 300mcg pre-filled syringe Ampoule 1:1000 (1mg/ml)	2 pre-filled syringes 1 box ampoules
Atropine	Ampoule 500mcg in pre-filled syringe	1 pre-filled syringe
Aspirin	Dispersible tablets 300mg	1 box of 28 tablets
DextroGel (or equivalent)	Oral Gel 80g	1 bottle
Diazepam	Rectal tubes 10mg (4mg/ml)	1 box of 5 tubes (2.5ml)
GTN	Spray 400mcg	1 spray
Naloxone	Prefilled syringe 2mg/2ml	1 prefilled syringe
Salbutamol	Inhaler 100mcg/inhalation	1 inhaler (and spacer)
Sodium chloride 0.9%	Infusion bag 0.9%	1x 500ml bag (and giving set)
Sodium chloride 0.9%	5ml ampoule	5 x 5ml ampoules

Emergency medicines may be held outside of locked storage if required to consolidate emergency equipment, bags must have tamper proof tags.

Medicines must be checked weekly for expiry date checking and ensuring contents present and fit for use, with a sheet signed and dated each time with the new tag number applied once re-sealed.
